Beyond the “From Evidence to Action” Roadshow

Revd Alan Hulme, Director and Team Leader of the Diocese of Guildford Parish Development and Evangelism Department, will visit Runnymede for the next Deanery Synod on Tuesday, 6 October (7:15pm for 7:30pm start) at St John's Church, Egham. At this meeting Alan will expand on the content of the Roadshow which explained some key things that we could learn from the “From Evidence to Action” (FETA) programme, which was a follow on from the previously discussed report 'From Anecdote to Evidence. FETA is a hands-on programme with case studies and resources available and the evening will be an interactive presentation that will give new insights and ideas to all participants.

This is an Open Synod Meeting and all are welcome!

Diocesan Vocations Evening “Hearing God’s Call”

On Sunday, 11 October at 7:30pm, Bishop Andrew will once more be visiting Runnymede to preach in a non-Eucharistic service with a vocational theme. The Bishop and William Challis will be available for further talks after the service. This will cover vocations in a wider sense but the focus will be on ordained ministry, including the testimony of one or two ordinands.

Dedication of Magna Carta Bells at St Mary's Church

On 8 September, St Mary's Church in Thorpe celebrated one of their patronal festivals, The Birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary, in conjunction with the dedication of their four new bells. The Very Revd Diana Gwilliams, Dean of Guildford Cathedral, presided over a Sung Eucharist and bravely climbed the Tower to baptise the new bells which were recently installed to complement four existing bells. The new bells were made possible through a grant from the Magna Carta 800 Commission and generous local donations, and all bear the Magna Carta 800 logo. The Thorpe Bells Project may well become the longest lasting part of the Magna Carta 800 celebrations, as "King John and the Barons", "Stephen Langton Archbishop of Canterbury" and "Adam Abbot of Chertsey" ring out to future generations.

Nigeria Link – Letter from Archbishop Edmund

At long last some positive and very interesting news from Kebbi:

"Greetings in the precious name of our Lord and master Jesus Christ. It's been quite a while and we rejoice in the fact that we have found the Lord by our side as we go through these trying times in the life of our nation and particularly in the north.

The money which the [Guildford] Cathedral gave towards a project in St James, we told the Cathedral Treasurer that it was used to buy some laboratory equipment for our chemistry lab. The money that was sent to us from the Diocese [of Guildford] was used to support ongoing projects in Kebbi, Gusau, Katsina, Wusasa, Ikara, and Bari dioceses which were meant to benefit both Muslims and Christians and strengthen their relationships. These dioceses have utilized the money in very meaningful ways. While two of them used the funds to complete a clinic in their rural areas others like us have added more money to it to build primary schools in very remote areas of our dioceses with over 80% Muslim population and employing Muslim teachers as part of our teaching staff.

Thanks for the offer from [All Saints' Church] New Haw to support the Diocese of Kebbi with their Harvest offering this year. Our concern over the years has been how we can become more relevant as a church to our communities. And one very big need which we find staring us in the face as we pay Episcopal visits to our rural churches is the sheer number of children without any opportunity to formal education, as even where such buildings are existing they lack qualified teachers to teach as the teachers avoid such areas because they all lack basic amenities. This is why as a diocese we have decided within our limited resources to assist in building primary schools for as many contiguous villages as we can. As a matter of fact, we have just laid the foundation for two such schools; one in Ribah and the other is in Dorowa. They are a block of six class rooms with a head teacher's office and toilets.
